- innovative methods in Public Mental Health research.

The **International Public Mental Health Summer School 2017** will create opportunities to explore the state of the art of Public Mental Health knowledge, develop research skills and build interdisciplinary and intersectoral networks across Europe.

ENROLLMENT TO THE COURSE: Admission may be granted to applicants who meet the following common admission criteria:

- The applicant to the course should hold at least undergraduate degree preferably in biomedical or social sciences.
- The Applicant shall submit an application form (1), university certified copy of diploma (2) and CV in English (3) by the application deadline to the email address marija.jakubauskiene@mf.vu.lt. Selection of candidates will be conducted by the International Scientific Committee of the Summer School.
- Application deadline for the **3rd International Public Mental Health Summer School 2017** summer course is **15 June, 2017**.

APPLICATION FEE: The Application fee has two options according to the economic development of the country of the applicant: for high income countries the fee is 350 Eur and 100 Eur for low and middle income countries. Reductions on application fee may be considered under the special request for participants from financially disadvantaged countries.
